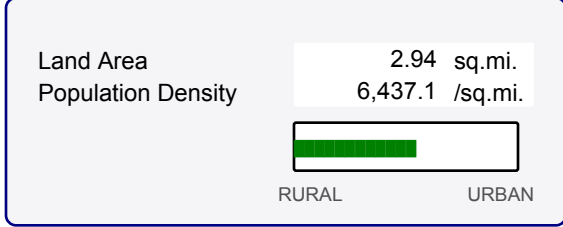


PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

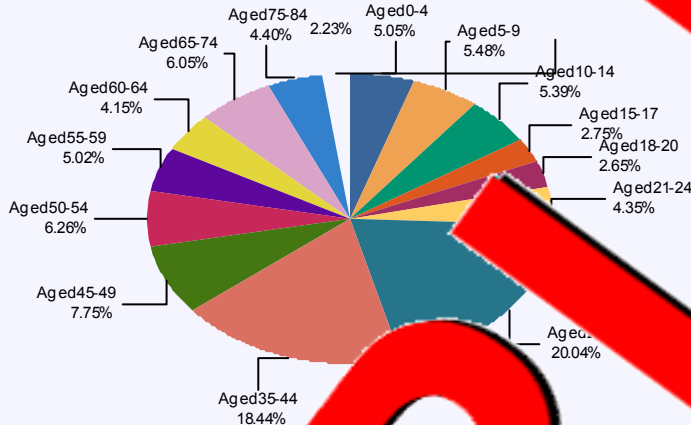

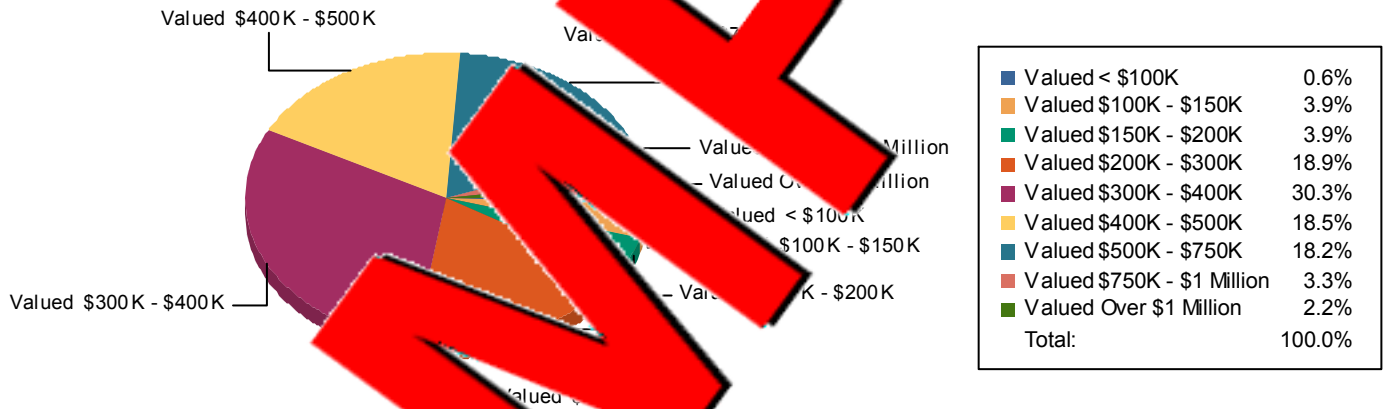
